

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

If you are anything like me, you may still be deciding what to give up or do for Lent even though we're already five days in. I know ... "Stop procrastinating!" Today's readings can help us enter more deeply into this season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. They are a reminder that Lent isn't primarily about us, as if it were a self-improvement project, but about taking the opportunity to go deeper into our relationship with God. Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are ways of reducing distractions in our life and focusing on God's mercy, his sacrifice for us, and his generosity and love. I am one who likes to control things and make plans, so the readings challenge me to look beyond myself, beginning with prayer, and ask the Lord to help me grow in faith. Paul writes, "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." Jesus exemplifies this dependence on God, allowing himself to be led to the desert by the Spirit. Each time the devil tempts him, he responds and in turn shows us how to respond: by turning to God and God's words, the source of our strength. As we choose how to observe the next 35 days, we are reminded to ask God to help us find those things that help draw us closer to him.

CRECE COMO DISCÍPULO |

ORAR, ESTUDIAR, ENVOLVERSE, SERVIR

Si eres como yo, es posible que todavía estés decidiendo a qué renunciar o hacer para la Cuaresma, aunque ya llevemos cinco días. Lo sé... "¡Deja de procrastinar!" Las lecturas de hoy pueden ayudarnos a entrar más profundamente en esta temporada de oración, ayuno y limosna. Son un recordatorio de que la Cuaresma no se trata principalmente de nosotros, como si fuera un proyecto de superación personal, sino de aprovechar la oportunidad para profundizar en nuestra relación con Dios. La oración, el ayuno y la limosna son formas de reducir las distracciones en nuestra vida y centrarnos en la misericordia de Dios, su sacrificio por nosotros, su generosidad y amor. Soy una persona a la que le gusta controlar las cosas y hacer planes, por lo que las lecturas me desafían a mirar más allá de mí mismo, comenzando con la oración, y pedirle al Señor que me ayude a crecer en la fe. Pablo escribe: "Todo aquel que invoca el nombre del Señor, será salvo". Jesús ejemplifica esta dependencia de Dios, dejándose conducir al desierto por el Espíritu. Cada vez que el demonio lo tenta, él responde y a su vez nos muestra cómo responder: dirigiéndonos a Dios y a las palabras de Dios, la fuente de nuestra fuerza. Al elegir cómo observar los próximos 35 días, se nos recuerda pedirle a Dios que nos ayude a encontrar aquellas cosas que nos ayuden a acercarnos más a él.

GO EVANGELIZE

PAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

What comes to mind when you picture a desert? I imagine sand, heat, thirst. It's more challenging to examine the landscape of my personal desert – barren places of prayer or too much focus on the details of everyday life. Lent, however, presents a rich opportunity to pause and reprioritize our lives based on Jesus' words in today's Gospel: "You shall worship the Lord, your God, and him alone shall you serve." Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving can help us do that, reminding us of our dependence on God and helping us shift our focus from ourselves to God and others. How we observe and experience Lent will differ for each of us. Whatever our personal desert looks like, we can rest assured that God will help us find our way back to him.

ACCOMPANIMENT

Find an accountability partner for Lent who can help you stay the course these next 40 days. Perhaps you can pray together each day, or simply send a text sharing how God is working in and through you in this penitential season.

¿Qué te viene a la mente cuando te imaginas un desierto? Me imagino arena, calor, sed. Es más desafiante examinar el paisaje de mi desierto personal: lugares estériles de oración o demasiado enfoque en los detalles de la vida cotidiana. La Cuaresma, sin embargo, presenta una gran oportunidad para hacer una pausa y volver a priorizar nuestras vidas en base a las palabras de Jesús en el Evangelio de hoy: "Al Señor tu Dios adorarás, y solo a él servirás". La oración, el ayuno y las limosnas pueden ayudarnos a hacer eso, recordándonos nuestra dependencia de Dios y ayudándonos a cambiar nuestro enfoque de nosotros mismos a Dios y a los demás. La forma en que observamos y experimentamos la Cuaresma será diferente para cada uno de nosotros. Cualquiera que sea nuestro desierto personal, podemos estar seguros de que Dios nos ayudará a encontrar el camino de regreso a él.

ACOMPAÑANDO

Encuentre un socio responsable para la Cuaresma que pueda ayudarlo a mantener el rumbo estos próximos 40 días. Tal vez puedan orar juntos todos los días, o simplemente enviar un mensaje de texto compartiendo cómo Dios está trabajando en y a través de ustedes en esta temporada de penitencia.

Fasting is eating less than you normally would. It's a good idea to give up a little something you like for Lent. Giving things up helps us remember we need God, not just food.


Almsgiving means giving to those who are in need. It helps us to be generous like God. Maybe you have a bit of money you can give to the poor or to the Church.



Each year «ParishName» and the Diocese of Brooklyn engage in the **Annual Catholic Appeal** which supports Catholic programs throughout Brooklyn and Queens and affects the lives of countless individuals and families living in our neighborhoods in addition to benefitting our parish.

How Does Our Parish Benefit?

In order for our parish to function, we need well-trained **priests and deacons** who can celebrate the sacraments and administer the parish. Without the **\$2.5 Million** from the Appeal allocated to vocations, we would not have the clergy our parish needs.

Our Children are the future of our parish and we are called to support them as they grow in faith. The Appeal provides funding which supports every parish **religious education program** as well as tuition assistance to those seeking **Catholic Education** at Catholic Academies and Schools. Over **\$2 million** from the Appeal is invested in the faith of our children in addition to also providing **adult faith formation**. Instruction programs for lay people, including those in our own parish, provide training in ministries such as Eucharistic Ministers and Lectors or prepare others for sacraments.

The Appeal also provides funding for the Youth Ministers working in parishes throughout Brooklyn and Queens. **\$150,000** each year from our donations sustains the **Catholic Youth Ministry Initiative**, which has been supported by Generations of Faith, ensuring that young people encounter Christ through the Church, forming life-long bonds of faith which will sustain our parishes for years to come.

Christ Himself has called all on us to care for those among us in need, but as one parish we lack the time, space, skills and volunteers that it takes to address the needs of all our brothers and sisters who need our help. This is why, through the Annual Catholic Appeal, our parish supports the work of **Catholic Charities** and **Catholic Migration Services** which receive a total of **\$1.4 million** from the Appeal. Together we are able to welcome the stranger, clothe the naked, feed the hungry and shelter the homeless in the name of our Church.

In our efforts to spread the Gospel of Christ we also have a responsibility as Catholics to minister to those who are ill, students in high schools and colleges as well as those who are imprisoned, just as Christ directed us to. The Appeal provides **\$1.9 million** to ensure that **chaplains** bring the sacraments of the church to those who are ill, imprisoned or are studying in high school and college.

Why is my participation important?

As followers of Jesus here at Holy Spirit Church, we understand our responsibility to our parish implies a responsibility to the diocese which unites us together with the entire Catholic community as the one body of Christ.

When one part of the body does not participate, the entire body suffers and makes it harder to function. Likewise, your participation in this Appeal, over and above your regular Sunday offering, will determine the ability of Holy Spirit Church to faithfully support the mission of Christ while also providing the needed support we receive as one parish, which is part of the larger Catholic Church.

Primer Domingo de Cuaresma

6º de Marzo (Deut 26:4-10 | Rom 10:8-13 | Lk 4:1-13)

La Cuaresma comienza con una reflexión sobre la Tentación de Jesús en el desierto. La Iglesia asigna historias de tentación al comienzo de la Cuaresma porque las tentaciones llegan a todos, no solo a Jesús, y parecemos casi genéticamente programados para ceder ante ellas.

La primera lectura describe el antiguo ritual judío de presentar los primeros frutos y regalos a Dios durante la fiesta de la cosecha para agradecerle por haber liberado a su pueblo de Egipto y por fortalecerlo durante los años de pruebas y tentaciones en el desierto. El Salmo Responsorial (Salmo 91), apunta a la tercera tentación de Satanás de Jesús en el desierto como se registra en el Evangelio de Lucas. En la segunda lectura, san Pablo advierte a los primeros cristianos convertidos del judaísmo que no cedan a la constante tentación de volver a la observancia de las leyes mosaicas. Les recuerda que sólo se salvarán reconociendo a Jesús resucitado como Señor y Salvador. Los estudiosos de la Biblia piensan que las tentaciones gráficas de Jesús descritas por Mateo y Lucas en sus Evangelios son representaciones pictóricas y dramáticas de la lucha interna contra una tentación que Jesús experimentó a lo largo de su vida pública. El diablo estaba tratando de evitar que Jesús cumpliera su misión de salvar a la humanidad de la esclavitud del pecado, principalmente a través de la tentación de convertirse en el Mesías político de las expectativas judías, y de usar su poder divino primero para su propia conveniencia y luego para evitar el sufrimiento y muerte.

Mensajes de vida: 1) Necesitamos enfrentar y vencer las tentaciones como lo hizo Jesús, usando los medios que él empleó: Como Jesús, cada uno de nosotros es tentado a buscar placeres pecaminosos, riqueza fácil y una posición de autoridad, y es atraído a la uso de medios injustos o pecaminosos para alcanzar buenos fines. Jesús es nuestro modelo para vencer las tentaciones a través de la oración, la penitencia y el uso efectivo de la “palabra de Dios”. Las tentaciones nos hacen verdaderos guerreros de Dios al fortalecer nuestra mente y corazón. Nunca somos tentados más allá de la fuerza que Dios nos da. En su primera carta, San Juan nos asegura: “El que está en vosotros es mayor que el que está en el mundo” (1 Juan 4,4). Por lo tanto, durante la Cuaresma, enfrentemos nuestras malas tendencias con la oración (especialmente participando en la Santa Misa), con la penitencia y con la lectura meditativa de la Biblia. El conocimiento de la Biblia nos prepara para el momento de la tentación al permitirnos “conocer a Jesús más claramente, amarlo más profundamente y seguirlo más de cerca, día a día”,

como dice William Barclay.

2) Necesitamos crecer en santidad durante la Cuaresma mediante la oración, la reconciliación y el compartir. Nos volvemos resistentes e incluso inmunes a las tentaciones a medida que nos hacemos más saludables en el alma siguiendo las prácticas tradicionales de Cuaresma: a) encontrando tiempo para estar con Dios todos los días de Cuaresma, hablándole y escuchándolo; b) arrepintiéndonos de nuestros pecados y renovando nuestra vida, uniéndonos a Dios tanto por el Sacramento de la Reconciliación como perdonando a los que nos han hecho daño y pidiendo perdón a los que hemos hecho daño; yc) compartiendo nuestro amor con los demás a través de nuestro servicio desinteresado y humilde, nuestra limosna y nuestra ayuda a los necesitados.

PARA LA REFLEXION

¿Cómo haré un BUEN uso de este tiempo de “Cuaresma” para mí, para poder renovar mejor en mente, cuerpo y corazón? ¿Qué disciplina(s) espiritual(es) practicaré para ayudarme a “recordar” (“recrear y hacer realidad”) todo lo que DIOS ha hecho por mí, especialmente en y a través de Jesús? ¿De qué manera compartiré mi relación de fe con otros para que ellos también puedan tener un tiempo de renovación durante esta temporada de Cuaresma? .
