Third Sunday of Easter

May 1° (Acts 5:27-32,40b-41 | Rev 5:11-14| Jn 21:1-19)

Today's Gospel narrative shows us the rehabilitation of Peter, who denied Jesus three times in the courtyard of Caiaphas, repented, and then received Primacy in the Church from Jesus. The Gospel also shows us God in search of man, even when man tries to evade Him.

The first reading, taken from the Acts of the Apostles, tells us how the Holy Spirit transformed Peter, whom Jesus had appointed head of his Church, from a man fearful of powerful men into a brave witness to the Resurrection. Peter stands before the Jewish Supreme Court – the Sanhedrin – boldly announcing that he and the others must obey God rather than men.

The second reading, taken from Revelation (the Apocalypse), presents John's vision of the Risen Lord as the glorified "Lamb of God," enthroned in Heaven. The whole of Revelation is an expression of Christian hope in the Risen Lord.

Today's Gospel tells the post-Resurrection story of our merciful Savior Who goes in search of His band of disappointed and dejected disciples. The incident proves that Jesus' post-Resurrection appearances were not mere hallucinations. In the first part of today's Gospel, the risen Jesus appears to His disciples and gives them a symbol of their mission in a miraculous catch of fish followed by a grilled fish breakfast prepared by Jesus himself. The second part is a dialogue between Jesus and Simon where Simon is asked three times whether he loves Jesus, and he answers that he does, as if in reparation for his triple denial of Jesus. The two metaphors used in the story, namely fishing and shepherding, are the duties of the Church in her missionary work. Peter, as a forgiven sinner, is chosen for the quality of his love to serve as leader in a community of brothers and sisters. As his primary mission, Peter is given the care of the vulnerable lambs and sheep, and he is told that fidelity to this mission will lead him to martyrdom.

Life messages: We need to open our eyes, ears and hearts wide to see, hear, and experience the Risen Lord coming into our lives in various forms, circumstances, and events:

1) The Risen Lord blesses us with success and achievements. We often fail to acknowledge the

presence of the Risen Lord behind our unexpected successes, great achievements, promotions at work, miraculous healings, and success in relationships. He is right there in our parties, celebrations, and occasions of rejoicing.

2) The Risen Lord is present in our pains and suffering: Acts 9:1-13 tells us how the Risen Lord transformed the life of Saul by pushing him down onto the Damascus Road and making him temporarily blind. The same Jesus often visits us in the form of accidents, illnesses, the loss of dear ones, pain, suffering, and problems in relationships.

3) The Risen Lord visits us through our friends and well-wishers: He is present in those who visit us and encourage us in our sad and desperate moments. The Risen Lord visits us in the form of unexpected help from the least expected persons in our dire needs.

4) The Risen Lord is present in our Christian worship: He is present on our altars during the Holy Mass to share His life with us; He is present in the words of Holy Scripture; He is there in the Sacraments, and He is there where two or three are gathered in his name (Mt 18: 20).

REFLEXION

When have I experienced great joy in being a follower of the Lord Jesus? Have there been times when it was hard to be a witness for Jesus? How would I respond to Jesus when He asks me: "Do you love me?" How will I live out my response to that questions? Who might be the most in need of my living out the love I have for the Lord Jesus?



Lord, please cure me! But if it is not Your will I accept it.



GROW AS A DISCIPLE |

PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

The accounts of Jesus' appearances to the disciples after his resurrection often puzzle me, and today's reading is no exception. There stands Jesus, within sight, yet the Apostles "did not realize that it was Jesus." Hello?! I know we're in the midst of a daylight saving time debate, but I'm fairly sure "dawn" meant the sun was up. Yet as soon as Jesus speaks and they follow his instructions, they realize he is their Lord. Simon Peter wastes no time; he dives into the sea and makes for the shore. Peter and the disciples show us that while it is important to recognize Jesus, it's what we do next that matters. As we learn in Acts, they boldly say his name despite the Sanhedrin's warning, and most will go on to be martyred for the Church. Thanks to them, we recognize Jesus – in the Eucharist, in Scripture, and in Tradition, and on the crucifixes in our homes and churches. Peter challenges us to "dive in," moving from faith to action. The specifics will differ for each of us, but we can study the lives of the Apostles and the saints to find inspiration.

GO EVANGELIZE

PARYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Is it a Catholic thing or the fact that I'm a closet introvert? I sometimes struggle with talking about Jesus. Which is why today's reading from Acts challenges me. The Sanhedrin had warned the Apostles not to even speak Jesus' name. Yet they don't cower in fear or simply go back to the relatively quiet lives they led before they met Jesus. They rejoice to be found worthy "to suffer dishonor for the sake of [Jesus'] name." Their commitment challenges us to be bold – not only with our words but with our actions as well. In the same way that teaching another person math or spelling helps us learn, witnessing to our faith by sharing it with others helps us deepen our faith and answer God's call to be his disciple, striving to build his kingdom on earth.

Los relatos de las apariciones de Jesús a los discípulos después de su resurrección a menudo me desconciertan, y la lectura de hoy no es una excepción. Allí está Jesús, a la vista, pero los Apóstoles "no se dieron cuenta de que era Jesús". ¡¿Hola?! Sé que estamos en medio de un debate sobre el horario de verano, pero estoy bastante seguro de que "amanecer" significaba que había salido el sol. Sin embargo, tan pronto como Jesús habla y siguen sus instrucciones, se dan cuenta de que él es su Señor. Simón Pedro no pierde el tiempo; se sumerge en el mar y se dirige a la orilla. Pedro y los discípulos nos muestran que si bien es importante reconocer a Jesús, lo que importa es lo que hacemos a continuación. Como aprendemos en Hechos, dicen con valentía su nombre a pesar de la advertencia del Sanedrín, y la mayoría serán martirizados por la Iglesia. Gracias a ellos, reconocemos a Jesús – en la Eucaristía, en la Escritura y en la Tradición, y en los crucifijos en nuestros hogares e iglesias. Pedro nos desafía a "sumergirnos", pasando de la fe a la acción. Los detalles serán diferentes para cada uno de nosotros, pero podemos estudiar las vidas de los Apóstoles y los santos para encontrar inspiración.

ANDA EVANGELIZA

ORANDO, INVITANDO, TESTIFICANDO, ACOMPAÑANDO

¿Es algo católico o el hecho de que soy un introvertido en el armario? A veces me cuesta hablar de Jesús. Es por eso que la lectura de hoy de Hechos me desafía. El Sanedrín había advertido a los Apóstoles que ni siquiera pronunciaran el nombre de Jesús. Sin embargo, no se encogen de miedo o simplemente regresan a las vidas relativamente tranquilas que llevaban antes de conocer a Jesús. Se regocian de ser hallados dignos de "sufrir deshonra por causa del nombre [de Jesús]". Su compromiso nos desafía a ser audaces, no solo con nuestras palabras sino también con nuestras acciones. De la misma manera que enseñar matemáticas u ortografía a otra persona nos ayuda a aprender, dar testimonio de nuestra fe al compartirla con otros nos ayuda a profundizar nuestra fe y responder al llamado de Dios de ser sus discípulos, esforzándonos por construir su reino en la tierra.

Tercer Domingo de Pascua

1º de Abril (He 5:27-32,40b-41 | Apoc 5:11-14| Jn 21:1-19)

La narración del Evangelio de hoy nos muestra la rehabilitación de Pedro, quien negó a Jesús tres veces en el patio de Caifás, se arrepintió y luego recibió la primacía en la Iglesia de Jesús. El Evangelio también nos muestra a Dios en busca del hombre, incluso cuando el hombre trata de evadirlo.

La primera lectura, tomada de los Hechos de los Apóstoles, nos cuenta cómo el Espíritu Santo transformó a Pedro, a quien Jesús había nombrado cabeza de su Iglesia, de hombre temeroso de los poderosos en valiente testigo de la Resurrección. Pedro se presenta ante el Tribunal Supremo judío, el Sanedrín, y anuncia audazmente que él y los demás deben obedecer a Dios antes que a los hombres.

La segunda lectura, tomada del Apocalipsis (Revelaciones), presenta la visión de Juan del Señor Resucitado como el "Cordero de Dios" glorificado, entronizado en el Cielo. Todo el Apocalipsis es expresión de la esperanza cristiana en el Señor resucitado.

El Evangelio de hoy cuenta la historia posterior a la Resurrección de nuestro Salvador misericordioso que va en busca de Su grupo de discípulos desilusionados y abatidos. El incidente prueba que las apariciones posteriores a la resurrección de Jesús no fueron meras alucinaciones. En la primera parte del Evangelio de hoy, Jesús resucitado se aparece a sus discípulos y les da un símbolo de su misión en una pesca milagrosa seguida de un desayuno de pescado a la parrilla preparado por el mismo Jesús. La segunda parte es un diálogo entre Jesús y Simón donde se le pregunta tres veces a Simón si ama a Jesús, y él responde que sí, como en reparación por su triple negación de Jesús. Las dos metáforas utilizadas en la historia, a saber, la pesca y el pastoreo, son los deberes de la Iglesia en su trabajo misionero. Pedro, como pecador perdonado, es elegido por la calidad de su amor para servir como líder en una comunidad de hermanos y hermanas. Como su misión principal, a Pedro se le da el cuidado de los corderos y ovejas vulnerables, y se le dice que la fidelidad a esta misión lo llevará al martirio.

Mensajes de vida: Necesitamos abrir bien los ojos, los oídos y el corazón para ver, escuchar y experimentar la llegada del Señor Resucitado a nuestras vidas en diversas formas, circunstancias y eventos:

1) El Señor Resucitado nos bendice con éxito y logros. A menudo no reconocemos la presencia del Señor Resucitado detrás de nuestros éxitos inesperados, grandes logros, promociones en el trabajo, curaciones

milagrosas y éxito en las relaciones. Él está presente en nuestras fiestas, celebraciones y ocasiones de regocijo.

2) El Señor Resucitado está presente en nuestros dolores y sufrimientos: Hechos 9:1-13 nos dice cómo el Señor Resucitado transformó la vida de Saulo empujándolo hacia el Camino de Damasco y dejándolo temporalmente ciego. El mismo Jesús nos visita a menudo en forma de accidentes, enfermedades, pérdida de seres queridos, dolor, sufrimiento y problemas en las relaciones.

3) El Resucitado nos visita a través de nuestros amigos y simpatizantes: está presente en quienes nos visitan y nos animan en nuestros momentos de tristeza y desesperación. El Resucitado nos visita en forma de ayuda inesperada de las personas menos esperadas en nuestras extremas necesidades.

4) El Señor Resucitado está presente en nuestro culto cristiano: está presente en nuestros altares durante la Santa Misa para compartir Su vida con nosotros; Está presente en las palabras de la Sagrada Escritura; Él está allí en los Sacramentos, y Él está allí donde dos o tres están reunidos en su nombre (Mt 18, 20).
